Registration—\$25.00 per student per year

All students, new and returning must register every school year. An application <u>MUST</u> be filled out and turned in to the ESPA office in order for the student to be allowed to attend classes for the school term.

Registration Periods are as follows:

- Fall Term— Begins: July 1st Ends: August 31st
- Winter Term—Begins: October 1st Ends: December 31st
 - Spring Term—Begins: February 1st Ends: March 31st

- Weekly Fee Payments Due every Monday \$20/\$25* covers 1 week of classes
- Daily Fee Due before class begins \$5 –
 Daily Fee applies to Adult Movement Classes Only



Attendance

Students progress best through consistent attendance. These are our policies regarding attendance.

- 1. If a student is unable to attend class, please call the office prior to the start of class.
- 2. There are NO REFUNDS for missed classes for ANY REASON.
- 3. Students are welcome to watch a class if they have an injury however, students should NOT come to class if they are too sick to dance or have missed day school due to illness.
- 4. Please be on time. Arriving late is not only a disruption to class, it also prevents the student from properly warming up and can therefore increase their chance of being injured. Students will not be allowed into class if more than 10 minutes late.
- 5. Students missing 6 or more classes in one subject will not be allowed to perform in the performance showcases.
- 6. If your child must leave early please notify the office and we will collect your child for you.

Cancellations

Classes may be cancelled due to weather, mandatory lockdowns or other unique circumstances. In these circumstances please call 242-824-4532 or check our facebook page for more information.

Dress Code / Uniform & Required Items

Students are required to wear the appropriate clothing and must have the proper shoes and other items needed for the particular class as follows:

*Dance Students – Requirements – Leotard, Tights, Dance Shoes eg. Ballet Shoes, Tap Shoes, Jazz Shoes, Gymnastic Shoes, Tennis Shoes for Hip Hop and Aerobics.

Dance Attire must be appropriate and not revealing (No low cut cleavage or buttocks should not be seen, no mid-drifts or sports bras only). Dance students can wear any color of their choice during class times but are required to wear the designated color for their class during official events and performances and for class pictures. Hair should be pulled back and away from the face. NO Hair Beads are allowed!

*Music Students – Requirements—

Music Practical Book, Music Theory Book, Pencil, Drum Sticks (drummers)

Music Students can wear any appropriate clothing of their choice but must wear an Emanji School T-Shirt and Black Dress Pants and shoes for official events and performances and Class Pictures.

*Circus Students – Requirements – Knee Pads, Juggling Balls, any other requested items

Uniform—Under Armour Shirt, Short Pants or Tights, Acro Shoes or Dance Sneakers. Any color can be worn during class times but the Emanji Suit attire is required for official events and performances and class pictures. Orders for the Emanji Suit can be placed in the office

*Drama Students - Requirements-

Exercise Book, Pencil

Drama Students can wear any appropriate clothing of their choice but must wear an Emanji School T-Shirt and Black Dress Pants and shoes for official events and performances and Class Pictures.

Please Note—T-shirts and other paraphernalia advertising other schools or with obscene/insulting language are not allowed.

School Etiquette

To help preserve our family friendly environment, we expect that you will:

- Treat staff, students, and your own family members respectfully. That includes no swearing, yelling, or roughhousing (pushing, shoving, and especially hitting) while in and around the school
- 2. All students are to sign in when they arrive and sign out when they leave the facility.
- No student will not be allowed to leave the premises or will be released unless authorized parents/guardians come up-stairs for their child/children. If your child is allowed to walk or catch the bus, a written consent should be given to the administrator.
- All students are to be properly attired when arriving and leaving the facility. No student should arrive or leave in just their dance attire.
- Students are asked to wait in the designated waiting area until the teacher admits them to class.
- Observation: Students progress much better if they can focus all of their attention on the teacher. Parents, family and friends are not permitted to watch classes unless other given permission by the Administrator.
- All students are to be picked up no later than 30 minutes after their class is over we will not be responsible for students after hours.
- 8. Students are expected to use the bathroom before class. Leaving in the middle of class will be discouraged. Bathrooms are available for non-dancers in emergencies only.
- 9. No eating or drinking inside the dance studios or music classroom.
- 10. Students are not allowed to fraternize with persons in the facility.
- 11. PLEASE do not chew gum or bring jewelry, cell phones or expensive personal items.
- 12. No Smoking on the school premises.
- Clean up after yourself. If a spill happens and you can't pick it up, please notify the staff immediately.
- Students who are not registered in the Emanji School of Performing Arts will not be allowed to attend classes without the permission of the Administrator.
